After an unavoidable hiatus, LWVGB will again be sending a monthly Voter to your inbox, thanks to Voter editor Yvonne Brakefield Knowles. This newsletter is full of news and links from the virtual LWVUS convention (across 7 time zones!) during the last week of June, introduction of new board members elected during our annual meeting on May 12, and updates on what LWVGB members are doing to encourage citizen participation while adhering to CDC guidelines during a pandemic.

At all three levels of League, we are in sound financial shape. Both national and state organizations have waived per member payments for students with no increases in per member payments for other members. Currently LWVGB dues are \$15 for students. Also we have no new program studies so we can concentrate on voter services/voter outreach during an election year.

While we take a monthly program break in July, our August program will be the Alabama Bar Suffrage Committee's outstanding documentary "The Fight for the Noblest Democracy: Women's Suffrage in Alabama". This film is entered in Birmingham's Sidewalk Film Festival Competition, so our program, scheduled for August 27, will be after the film's premiere earlier that week. This is a film that you will want to enjoy with your children or grandchildren.

Memberships have steadily increased during the spring and summer, and we are currently at 120! The <u>LWVAL civil lawsuit</u> against the Secretary of State to ease absentee ballot restrictions has been one factor. Another has been two sets of ads that have run on WBHM urging completion of the census, use of Vote411, and the voter education purpose of LWV.

<u>Vote411</u> is a nonpartisan website funded by the League of Women Voters that enables voters to be more informed by giving them access to candidates' responses to questions that the LWV has posed.

VOTING DURING A GLOBAL PANDEMIC

Because of the importance of voting absentee during a pandemic, LWVGB members have distributed hundreds of applications for absentee ballots before the July 9 deadline to request a ballot. Former LWVGB President Ida Tyree-Hyche-Hill and Dr. Carl Hill distributed over 300 applications during a free food drive through at Zion Star Missionary Baptist Church in west Birmingham. They posted reminders about the deadline on social media and sent reminders to church members using the LWV link for downloading absentee ballots. Leonette Slay provided 175 absentee ballot applications for the Bluff Park UMC food pantry drive through on July 3 and 100 applications for Urban Ministry clients in west Birmingham. Wild Roast Cafe owners in Bluff Park also requested that absentee voting applications be placed in their shop for customers. We anticipate offering this outreach service in selected locales for August 25 municipal elections and more broadly for the November 3 general election.

A REPORT FROM LWV NATIONAL CONVENTION 2020

I had the opportunity to attend the LWVUS convention as a first-time attendee this year. I must admit that I was not excited about attending a virtual convention as I anticipated that I would be spending hours sitting at my computer. In recent months I have spent more time in front of a computer screen and like everyone else I have Zoom fatigue.

I am happy to report that the experience was far less painful than I thought it would be. Kudos to all of the people involved in the massive undertaking of designing a virtual convention for close to 2000 attendees.

The week began with the opportunity to attend various caucuses which were offered Monday-Wednesday evenings. There was a plethora of options (28) to choose from which speaks to the depth and breadth of the League's work.

LWVAL was represented by our own Kathy Jones from the Tennessee Valley League. She was one of the presenters for the "Youth Voter Registration and Education Programs" A link to the power point presentation can be found <u>here.</u>

An important caucus was "Making Democracy Work in the Criminal Justice System". The response to this caucus was so overwhelming that many of the delegates who had registered for this event (including me) were unable to join live. The business portion of the meeting occurred Thursday- Saturday. You can access the convention workbook here.

An important resolution which was passed by an overwhelming vote was the Racial Justice for Black People and all People of Color. Alabama was one of the 23 Leagues which initially signed on to this resolution. You may access the resolution <u>here</u>.

It is impossible to cover all of the convention activities in a brief report. In closing, I would like to share this link to a <u>voting rights panel discussion</u> featuring Valerie Jarrett and others. This was a very engaging panel discussion and I hope that you will have time to listen.
