Last month we celebrated virtually the 101st birthday of the League. Now March gives us a trifecta of recognition opportunities: International Women's Day on March 8<sup>th</sup>, Women's History Month, and Sunshine Week (March 14-20). All month we recognize women's contributions throughout history and in our current society. Women's History Week started in the school district of Sonoma County, CA in 1978 and quickly gained popularity in other parts of the country. President Carter issued a proclamation in 1980 declaring the week of March 8 as Women's History Week--to coincide with International Women's Day, which dates back to European celebrations in 1911.
