As a member of LWVGB and Honorary Consul for Ukraine to Alabama I wanted to ask and implore


adopted second homeland. These are people who embody the spirit of freedom and democracy that we as LWVGB strive to promote. We have seen over 1,700 Russians





ALABAMA ELECTION NOTES: THE 2022 ELECTION CALENDAR


2022 is a **General Election year** which means there will be many voter and candidate related dates
