LOCAL GROUPS HOST HOOVER CITY COUNCIL FORUM

Hoover, AL – BluffParkAL.org, the Bluff Park Neighborhood Web Site, and the League of Women Voters of Greater Birmingham will host a forum for Hoover City Council candidates on August 21st.

The forum is scheduled for 6:30 p.m. at Artists on the Bluff located in the old Bluff Park Elementary School building at 569 Park Avenue, Hoover, 35216. All Hoover residents are welcome to attend.

Four of Hoover's seven Council seats have candidates vying for the at-large seats. In Place 1, incumbent Dr. Trey Lott faces DeMarcus Hill. In Place 3, incumbent Mari Morrison faces John Lyda. In Place 6, incumbent and President Pro Tem Brian Skelton faces Ken Teter. In Place 7, incumbent John Greene faces Jason Cerniglia and Ken King.

Mayor Gary Ivey, Council President Jack Wright, and council members John Natter and Gene Smith faced no opposition and were certified as winners on August 6.

The forum is designed to allow residents to hear from council hopefuls. Residents will also be able to ask questions.
